Special Day for Senator Pruitt

The St. Lucie River Chapter presented to Ken Pruitt retired Florida State Senator, the Sons of the American Revolution Silver Good Citizenship Medal. Ken served the Treasure Coast Region for 19 years, first as a member of the Florida House of Representatives and then as a Senator also serving for 2 years as the Senate President and presently is associated with a local law firm as a consultant. The Chapter was especially proud to give this award to Ken and as he told us his lovely wife, Aileen. Ken has sponsored many peices of





legislation, the best known and loved, the Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program. This is the merit based state scholarship funded by the Florida Lottery, with

presently 170,000 students enrolled and being aided with this program. Ken has also been active with the restoration of the Everglades and with the reformation of the Florida Legislatures procedures and methods. The Chapter wishes Ken and Aileen a long, healthy, prosperious career and success in all of their endeavors.

The Daughters of Liberty Medal authorized in 1992, may be presented to any lady, by the National Society, a District, a State Society or a Chapter by any officer in appreciation for her unselfish devotion, tireless efforts, and assistance to the SAR. She should have dedicated her time, energy, ability or finances to the organization in support and furtherance objectives of the National Society, SAR

The medal is considered second to only the Gold Good Citizenship Medal. The medal should be awarded only after either the Medal of Appreciation or the Martha Washington Medal. The medal is gold in color and depicts a revolutionary woman astride a galloping horse as a dedicated patriot aiding the struggle for independence. The Medal is suspended from a drape of blue, yellow, blue bands of equal sized bands. The name and the date of awarding is engraved on the reverse.

The Teddy Bear Express


