
## Theodore Roosevelt

The fourth in the seriers and probably the most intersting of all the Presidents, who were members of the SAR, Theodore Roosevelt. Born October 27, 1858 he was a sickly boy, who had asthma, to help his physical problems, Roosevelt began a life time of heavy physical activity, he was home schooled studying natural history, he attended Harvard University then entered Columbia Law School the following year but left early, in1881 when he was elected to the New York assembly as the youngest member, he was 23 years old. In 1880 Roosevelt married Alice Hathaway Lee and in 1884 with the birth of their first child, Alice, Alice Hathaway Lee, the mother passed away of Bright's Disease (Kidney Failure). Roosevelt would remarry in 1886 his childhood sweetheart Edith Carow, they would have five children Theodore Jr., Kermit, Ethel, Archie and Quentin. 1882 Roosevelt would publish his first major historical work "The Naval War of 1812". This extremely well researched book established him as a serious historian and would set a mark for the future. In 1884 after the



death of his wife and his Mother, who died on the same day, Roosevelt attended the Republican National Convention. In a bitter fight over the candidacy of James Blain, Roosevelt left the convention disillusioned and bitter, he retired to his Dakota ranch which he had purchased the previous year. He would spend the next three years in the Dakotas ranching and with the horribly bitter winter of 1886/1887 was wiped out along with his neighbors, losing his \$60,000 investment. Roosevelt returned to New York in 1886 and did two things, first he married Edith Carow in London and second ran for Mayor of New York City, as the Dakota cowboy, he finished third, but he did get re-involved with politics. He campagained vigorously for Benjamin Harrison in 1888, for his efforts he was appointed to the United States Civil Service Commission. Roosevelt would serve on this committee until 1895, fighting fiercely for reform and against spoils politics. He was so fierce in fighting this bane on America, that when Harrison lost in 1892 Grover Cleveland appointed him to the same position. In 1895 Roosevelt was appointed to the position of President of the Board of New York City Police Commissioners, during this two years at the job he would change the NYPD forever; standardizing sidearms, establishing new disciplinary rules, physical and mental examinations, and even had the telephone installed in the station houses. Roosevelt even would walk an officers beat late at night or early in the morning to make sure he was doing his Urged by Henry Cabot Lodge, President William McKinley appointed Roosevelt the Assistant Secretary of the Navy in 1897, he would rattle many cages through out the Navy and when war broke out with Spain he resigned and with the aid of Col. Leonard Wood founded the First United States Volunteer Cavalry Regiment, "the Rough Riders". the unit made up of mostly cowboys from the West. Roosevelt would be second in command with Wood being the Colonel, but through a series of events Leonard Wood was promoted to Brigadier General and Roosevelt was promoted to Colonel in command of the Rough Riders. He would become famous for his actions at the Battle of Kettle Hill and San Juan Hill in Cuba and would be nominated for the Congressional Medal of Honor, Congress would disallow it but in 1997 Roosevelt was renominated and in 2001 was awarded the Medal posthumously by President William J. Clinton. In 1898 Roosevelt would be elected Governor of New York and then in 1899 he was selected to run with President William McKinley for the office of Vice President of the United On September 6, 1901 President McKinley was shot by an assassin and on September 14, 1901 died and Theodore Roosevelt was sworn in as President of the United States. In 1904 he was re-elected on his own and then in 1905 two major events occurred, first Roosevelt signed the Charter for the National Society Sons of the American Revolution and second he successfully negotiated the end of the Russo-Japanese War, for this he would be awarded the Nobel Peace Prize. Roosevelt would decline to run in 1908, but in 1912 disgusted with the Taft Administration he ran for the Republican Nomination, when he did not gain the nomination he formed his own political party the "Bull Moose Party". At a campaign speech in 1912 there would be an assassination attempt on his life, the assassin would shoot him in the chest, but the bullet did not penetrate into the chest cavity, Roosevelt realizing he was wounded but not seriously went on the deliver a 90 minute speech, that had a bullet hole through the papers. Roosevelt would continue to be active, he would explore parts of the Amazon River Basin during 1913/1914 discovering a river which today bears his name. Roosevelt would attempt to raise a volunteer regiment for World War I but President Wilson would not accept it. He would continue to be active until his death in his sleep on January 6, 1919 at the age of 60. It is said " Death had to take Roosevelt sleeping, for if he had been awake, there would have been a fight."

In conclusion Roosevelt was a unique person, the only person in history to win the highest honor his country can give for bravery in war and the greatest honor the world gives for peace, the Nobel Peace prize. He and his son Theodore Roosevelt Jr. are one pair of the two fathers and sons, who have won the Medal of Honor, Theodore Roosevelt Jr won his for his bravery on the Normandy Beaches on June 6, 1944, the other pair Arthur Mc Arthur and his son, Douglas McArthur, All four SAR members. Roosevelt is ranked as the fourth or fifth greatest President in American History, he was not only a politician but an author, a historian, a explorer, a naturalist and a conservationist, and possibly his greatest accomplishment and gift he gave to us as Americans is our National Park system. He deserves that fourth spot on the mountain in South Dakota.
